It can be used as a simple scratchpad for quick notes and ideas, or as a personal contacts organizer, bookmark manager, project manager, password storage and much more. Advanced users can also take advantage of macros and plugins. You can customize the appearance of your entries, add icons and more.

[PhoneDeck](#)

PhoneDeck is a personal address and phone organizer. It offers incremental search, full search, shortcut links, alphabet index and categories with custom icons to organize your contacts. Also supported are email and web links, quick access to favorite email contacts, direct phone dialing and more. In addition, you can create internal shortcuts to link one contact with another. PhoneDeck includes an import/export wizard that allows you to import from .csv and export to text, .CSV and HTML.

MetatOGGer

MetatOGGer enables you to tag, rename and organize your Ogg Vorbis, FLAC, Speex and MP3 files. It allows you to rename files based on their existing tags and also by their folder path (useful if your folder path contains the relevant artist and album names). Other features include file organizing based on tag info (copy, move etc.), manual tagging and cleaning of unwanted tags.

VisiTrax

VisiTrax reads your music CDs. Just pop in your music CDs and VisiTrax can fetch their track titles for you automatically from the internet, using the CDDb database. The program efficiently organizes your CDs, records, tapes, and more. You can also name your own categories and media formats or quickly locate material with wild-card matching. Additional features include DJ playlist, tabsheet views, integrated CD player and an example database to get you started. This version is free for small libraries under 1000 tracks or 100 CDs.

File Waster

File Waster allows you to protect your files from prying eyes, using secure encryption technology. You can encrypt files or folders, combine them into secure cabinets and optionally compress them before encrypting. FileBuddy also includes secure file deletion, allowing you to wipe your files beyond recovery, using different security levels.

Paste & Save

You found some useful text on the Web or in a text document and you've copied it to the Clipboard. Now, before you can copy another text, you'll need to open up a text editor, paste the current copy and then save it. Forget about it! Paste & Save will do this for you automatically. The program helps you to sort your information by importance, has many useful features and handy interface.

February 2009 Question of the Month:

Why do I need to install Java and how do I find out which version I have installed?

Answer:

Java is a programming language that allows programs and applications to execute on more several operating systems, namely Windows, Linux, and Unix. You need to have the Java runtime software installed for running these types of programs, which may be run through your browser or outside the browser.

Sun Microsystems provides this page of all the [latest Java runtime software releases](#). If you have Java SE 6 Update 7, then you have the latest security fixes

and probably do not need the latest version.. To find out which Java version you have installed, simply visit Javatester.org. You can actually have 2, or even more, versions of Java installed, so using javatester.org is a good way to find out which and how many versions you've got.

Don't get confused with Java versus JavaScript. JavaScript comes with all web browsers. It allows them to present more information quicker so the user experience is more interactive and rich.
